### Isbjørn!: Performance and programme notes

*Isbjørn!* is intended to be performed in a large space, preferably with 1 or 2 seconds of reverberation. The five groups of singers should be grouped in the following way.

# STAGE SATB choir I - SATB choir II piano, percussion Conductor

Gallery stage right Women's choir

Gallery stage left Children's choir

#### REAR GALLERY Vocal Quintet

If galleries are not available then floor level will have to do, but all singers should be able to see the conductor easily, otherwise sub-conductors may have to be employed.

The five movements should follow one another without a pause, discouraging any applause until the entire piece is finished.


Isbjørn! was conceived during a trip to the High Arctic in the autumn of 2012 and was inspired by the northern landscapes and maritime settings. One was humbled by the grandeur of the land and the open sky, uncluttered by human habitation, and stilled by the almost complete and utter silence. For us on the expedition the polar bear became a mythical creature; we were aware of its existence, we spoke about it frequently, we saw footprints, but it was not until the last few days that we actually encountered one. With the drastic environmental changes resulting recently from global warming, the habitat of the polar bear is at risk, and the future of this magnificent animal is uncertain. Isbjørn! is intended, in its small way, as a means of raising awareness of the fragility of the Arctic and its inhabitants.

The first two performances of *Isbjørn!* are scheduled to take place in Victoria, BC. on November 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013, with the following performers: Ensemble Laude, Via Choralis chamber choir, Vox Humana chamber choir, Viva Youth Choirs, and Hexaphone, conducted by Nicholas Fairbank.
